The role

Mansfield College Boat Club is looking to appoint a Head Coach who will begin in the 2025/26 academic year. MCBC is a friendly and inclusive club, with definite potential on both sides. Several members in recent years have gone on to train with and represent the University. We pride ourselves on our enthusiasm and team spirit and subsequently have many committed returners this year – providing the potential for a very successful year of racing.

The role involves coaching the top boats for MCBC (the First Open VIII and the First Women's VIII). It will also require coordinating with the assistant coach(es) to effectively train up novices and ensure the boats are competitive. The Head Coach should take a genuine interest in the success of the Boat Club and be prepared to dedicate significant time and energy towards it.

Responsibilities

- Available to coach 12 sessions a week, including outings and land training (ergs, tanks, strength & conditioning) during term time: 12th October–6th December 2025; 18th January–14th March 2026; 26th April–20th June 2026.
- Be available to coach for the full academic year 2025–26 (likely to include training camps outside of term time), mainly morning sessions (off the water by 8:30am) and weekends, with a shift to evenings around April
- Be available and open to continuing the coaching role for an additional two years if mutually agreed
- Create on and off water training plans for term time and vacations
- Positive coaching style providing constructive feedback to rowers and coxes
- Be available for bank-riding at major college rowing regattas (typically just after halfway through terms 2 and 3)
- Work well with the rest of the coaching team and boat club committee (e.g. setting outings and crew selection)
- Meetings every term with the President to report on progress; at the end of the year the Boat Club's Senior Member will be present at this meeting.

Experience

- Proven experience coaching competitive crews at club, university, or higher levels.
- Experience developing rowing programs and seasonal training plans.
- Demonstrated success in athlete development and performance improvement.

Leadership & Management

- Strong leadership and team management skills, including the ability to motivate and manage athletes, assistant coaches, and volunteers.
- Experience in managing training squads with varied levels of ability.
- Ability to plan and deliver training camps, races, and logistics.

Technical Knowledge

- Deep understanding of rowing technique (sculling and sweep), rigging, and equipment maintenance.

Safety & Welfare

- Commitment to maintaining high standards of health, safety, and welfare on and off the water.
- Understanding and enforcement of water safety regulations and club policies.

Planning & Organisation

- Strong organisational skills with the ability to plan sessions, regatta schedules, and long-term development programs.
- Ability to manage time and resources efficiently.

Commitment & Availability

- Willingness to commit to early mornings, weekends, and travel to regattas or training camps.
- Long-term vision for the growth and success of the club.

Desirable selection criteria

- Familiar with bumps racing
- Ability to help train and coach novice and returning coxes
- Coxing ability

Coaching Qualifications

- Recognised national or international rowing coaching qualification (e.g. British Rowing Level 2 or above).
- Valid first aid certification
